### How do we do a difference?

We closely work with all quadruple helix actors - it means with SMEs, Research organizations, Providers of public health or social services, Representatives of elderly care recipients and their family members.

The project fosters the delivery and deployment of highly innovative solutions for social and health home care through co-creation approaches.

It means that end users are able to influence functions the product will have, its look and other features.

### How does it look like in praxis?

- We provide 2 innovative Tools for application of co-creation among SMEs and public providers of home care.
- We build knowledge in co-creation for 285 employees of SMEs or public service providers.
- We demonstrate an impact by running 6 pilots with Public social care providers and 12 pilots with SMEs.
- We aim to do a systematic change in the territorial ecosystems.

Boosted knowledge, good-practice and impact of 18 pilots, together with facilitated Co-creation Labs in every territory, will represent the critical mass for further and sustainable shift towards Open Innovation 2.0. ecosystems.



## NETWORK OF CO-CREATION LABS

We facilitate an informal transregional network of Co-creation Labs to connect all actors and increase common learning during and after the project.

The aim of this network is to raise awareness and increase knowledge of all relevant quadruple helix actors for home health and social care.

The purpose of this Network is to connect Quadruple helix actors in order to cooperate inside each Co-creation Lab in order to develop new, extremely useful innovative products and services.

Our ultimate goal is to make sure that public service providers and SMEs are going to adapt the co-creation approach for every designed service or developed product.



## TOOLS

The partnership develops and design SME and POLICY TOOLS.

SME Tool for delivery of innovative Home Care solutions will build on best industrial praxis for ICT in health & social solutions and follow good practice methodological steps in industrial co-creation, together with the application of extended Lean Start-up methodology.

Policy Tool for co-creation of public health or social home care services will build on the Method for involving citizens and civil servants in the development of Government (primary eGovernment) services.

Both Tools enable the involvement of multi-end user group to co-creation process in order to boost digital-based health and social home care solutions in all regions of Central Europe.



## TRAININGS

During the project duration, we train 285 people in using co-creation principles.

To share a high-quality knowledge, we develop a Knowledge pack that serves as a core education Tool for the individual, institutional and stakeholder knowledge advancement about adapting of co-creation approaches and using previously developed Tools.

Partners also organize trainings for SMEs and Providers of public services during Open HoCare2.0 conferences, Go HoCare2.0 roadshows that are going to take place in different countries during the project duration.

Therefore, trainings ensure constant awareness and knowledge building in Central Europe territories.



## PILOT ACTIONS

12 SMEs and 6 Providers of public health and social care services participate in pilot testing.

In total, 18 institutions in all territories demonstrate the usability and impact of developed Tools at the delivery of innovative health of social home care solutions by co-creation involving elderly care recipients and their family members. Pilots also provide important examples of good praxis in Central Europe.

Success stories of implemented pilots are important enablers to form a positive attitude towards co-creation approach in Central Europe. Also, they help to change the behaviour of SMEs and public care providers in future so they use the co-creation approach repeatably.
